Rules

The oldest known rules of golf were written in 1744 by an Edinburgh Golf Club – in the original rules you had to tee off within a club's length of the hole. The Richmond Golf Club drafted additional rules during the Second World War, so players would know what to do if bombs were dropped mid-game. These duties included collecting any shrapnel (as it could damage the lawnmowers) and being allowed to take cover during gunfire or bombings and replace a ball displaced by enemy action without penalty.
